Other souvenirs are in the works too. Also on display are photos of the last big parade held in Lee at the Bicentennial in 1966 and other items from that celebration.



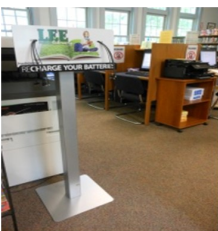

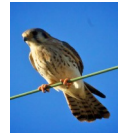
